In 2024, NHA advocated for several key issues affecting our region. Some of those include Drainage Improvements for the IH-69 Southbound Frontage Road and FM 1314 Stream Crossing in Porter, the addition of the Halls Bayou Flood Risk Management and Ecosystem Restoration Project to the 2024 WRDA Bill, the Harris County Flood Control District's proposed (now approved) Tax Increase, and the reevaluation of scoring for the Harris-Galveston Area Council's Regional Transportation Plan Projects.
